








## BRONZE DofE 2025



A huge congratulations to all our Year 10 students who completed their Bronze DofE expedition last weekend. We were blessed with excellent weather!



# YEAR IO EXPLORE NORFOLK



As part of their Geography GCSE, Year 10 students carried out two days of fieldwork along the north Norfolk coast, visiting Cromer, Happisburgh and Sheringham. Data was collected using a number of methods, relating to both the physical and human elements of the course.


For the physical side, we visited beaches at Happisburgh and Sheringham looking for evidence of geomorphic processes, such as erosion and longshore drift. Evidence of erosion was obtained by measuring pebble sizes from the front to the back of the beach to look for change, and by wave counts to see what type of waves were present. For longshore drift, sediment height was measured either side of the groynes, and by using the famous 'orange' method, which involves throwing an orange into sea and seeing how far it travels over a certain amount of time and in what direction. Students also mapped the beach by recording beach profiles, and assessed the condition of the coastal management (seawalls, groynes etc.) to see how well it was being maintained. All this data allowed students to see if geomorphic processes were occurring, and why they might differ in different locations.

For human geography, students were collecting data to determine how important Sheringham is as an economic hub on the north Norfolk coast. Methods used included environmental quality surveys to see how well the area was maintained and land use surveys to see what types of premises are there, such as shops, banks, homes etc. Students also collected the views of local residents using questionnaires. This was also repeated in Cromer, which allowed students to make comparisons and to see which is the most important place for the local economy. Apart from all the hard work, we also had time to enjoy the fantastic weather with lunch on the beach, and traditional seaside activities such as visiting the amusements, fish & chips and ice cream! There was also time for some impromptu karaoke one night, back at the hostel.

The year 10s were exemplary on the trip, both around Cromer and Sheringham, and at the hostel. While out and about we received favourable feedback from the local residents, commenting on how well behaved and polite the students were, representing Birchwood in a positive light.



Following the Year I 2 visit to the UCAS Discovery event back in March we held our annual Kickstart Day at the start of this term.

Students were off timetable for the day so they could focus on preparing for their Post 18 decision making. We ran a carousel of sessions which included 'The UCAS Process', 'Personal Statements' and 'Applying for a Job/Apprenticeship'. We were very grateful for the support from Anglia Ruskin University and Dee Owusu-Ansah, an Employment Support Officer from Clarion Futures who both delivered sessions on the day.

Students were also given time to reflect on what they had learnt during the day and to start exploring their Post 18 options.



# A LEVEL SCIENCE IN ACTION



Our A Level Environmental Science and Biology students recently took part in two fantastic trips designed to enrich their understanding of key topics and provide valuable hands-on learning experiences.

Biology students visited Wicken Fen National Nature Reserve in Cambridgeshire, where they enjoyed a sunny day of fieldwork. Activities included random sampling, transect sampling, and pond dipping for aquatic invertebrates – all delivered by reserve experts. These practical tasks not only brought learning to life but also contributed to the compulsory practical elements of both A Level courses.

Environmental Science students visited the Natural History Museum in Tring, where they explored six galleries featuring over 4,000 fascinating animal specimens, including taxidermy displays, skeletons, eggs, and nests. A highlight of the day was a workshop on Biodiversity and Conservation, which offered real-world context to classroom learning and deepened students' understanding of human impact on ecosystems.


