### Art Trip to Zoology & Sedgwick Museums in Cambridge

Year 10 Art students are going to spend the day in the Zoology and Sedgwick Museum in Cambridge on Thursday 23 October 2025. This visit is designed to inspire creativity and support our ongoing work in art and design by giving students the opportunity to draw from real-life objects, exhibitions, and interactive installations.

Students will be encouraged to observe and sketch artefacts, designs, and exhibits which will support our art topic on layers. The museum offers a rich environment for artistic exploration and visual inspiration including animal and dinosaur skeletons, fossils, and maps.

Students will travel by coach to Cambridge leaving school at 9am and returning at approximately 3pm, subject to traffic. They will be allowed to contact parents on the journey home when we know what traffic conditions are like so that you are able to collect them from school. Students will wear school uniform and will need to bring a packed lunch and water bottle with them along with a sketchbook and dry drawing materials.


