MUSIC

The WJEC Eduqas A Level Music course offers a broad and exciting mix of styles, giving students the opportunity to explore both classical and popular music in depth. You'll study the development of the symphony through key orchestral works, helping you understand how musical elements and language have evolved over time.

Alongside this, you'll compose your own piece of music inspired by the techniques and styles of the period. You'll also have the chance to personalise your studies by choosing

from areas such as Pop and Rock, Musical Theatre, or Jazz, as well as exploring music from the early twentieth century or the late twentieth and early twenty-first centuries.

This course is perfect for students who enjoy performing, composing, and discovering how different styles of music connect and influence one another.
